TIP 1




Check your classroom air quality monitor often.

Use the table below and if CO₂ levels are climbing or high, ask your teacher to open some windows and doors.

TIP 2

CO₂ levels are highest just before break or lunchtime.

Before you leave your classroom open all windows and doors to clear the room of CO₂ while the room is empty.

TIP 3

Opening windows and doors on opposite sides of your classroom brings in more outdoor air.

TIP 4

Open windows in corridors and leave your classroom door open to help outdoor air flow through.
